How will my child be involved in the process and be able to contribute their views?

Your child's views are important to us. We believe it is vital that children understand why they are receiving support and what they can do to work towards their targets.

All children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 have individual targets for English and Maths. Their class teacher discusses their targets with them, and they understand what they need to do to achieve their targets. Children are involved in setting their own targets where appropriate. They are also involved in reviewing their progress towards their targets informally through discussions with their class teacher.

If your child has additional needs, they may require an Individual Support Plan with more specific and personalised targets. They will be involved in discussions with relevant staff about their needs, the support they will receive and their progress. They will be invited to review any support they have been given, giving feedback orally or through drawings/writing, and encouraged to consider their new targets as part of our cycle of support.

What opportunities will there be for me to discuss my child's progress, attainment and achievement?

We always have the time to speak with you about your child and are always here to listen and support.

- If you have concerns or questions regarding your child's progress or attainment your child's class teacher will be happy to talk with you about these. It may sometimes be necessary to make an appointment to meet at a mutually convenient time.
- If your child's teacher has concerns regarding their progress or attainment, they will always discuss these with you.
- You will be invited to attend Parent Consultation evenings twice a year to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher. There will be an opportunities at these points to look at your child's work.
- If your child has an Individual Support Plan, you and your child will also be invited to meetings 3 times a year, to formally review their targets with the SENDCO and the class teacher
- If your child has an Education & Health Care Plan you will also be invited to a formal annual review alongside any relevant external agencies and school staff to discuss their progress, attainment and next steps.
